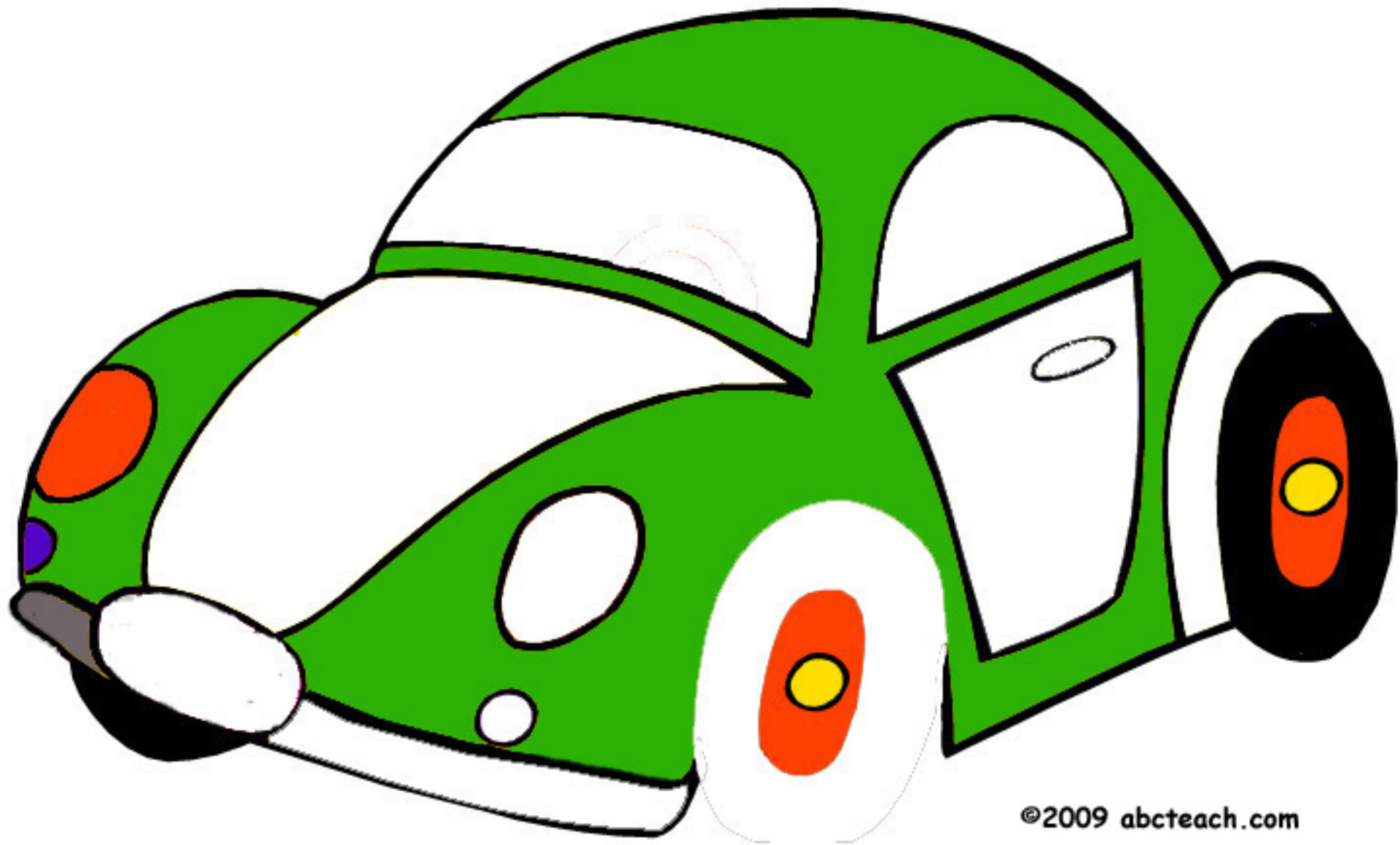

SPARE PARTS

Car Puzzle Instructions

Print one puzzle board and one “Spare Parts” page for each player or each team. Use card stock and laminate if desired. Cut out the “spare parts”.

Multiple Use Game Board—playing for spare parts

A moderator has list of questions (around 40) compiled by teacher. Questions can be thematic, like grammar or culture, or random trivia type questions, as long as content is appropriate for the players.

Each player or each team has a puzzle board. The moderator has a complete set of “spare parts” (cut out to fit the white spaces on the puzzle board) for each team or each player.

In turn, the players will state which part they are playing for: “I am playing for the hood”. The moderator then asks a question. If answered correctly, the player receives the part and places it in the appropriate spot on the puzzle board. The first to complete the puzzle wins.

For added competitiveness, the game can be played with only one set of spare parts. Players can play for the parts in possession of the moderator or bid to take the part from each other. The winner is the one who gets all the parts or who has the most parts when the game ends.
