

German Vocabulary—Furniture Card Game

Instructions:

- 1. Print several copies of the cards on the following page, cut out and laminate.**
- 2. Shuffle cards and deal face down until all cards have been dealt.**
- 3. To complete pairs, players take turns asking for cards they need, i.e. “Do you have a table card?”.**
- 4. For a better learning effect, ask the question in German (“Hast du eine ‘Tisch’ Karte?” or just “Hast du einen ‘Tisch?’”).**
- 5. The game is over when all pairs have been collected. The player with the most pairs wins.**
- 6. As an alternative, you can print more cards and have players work alone or in teams to collect enough pairs to “furnish a house” etc.**

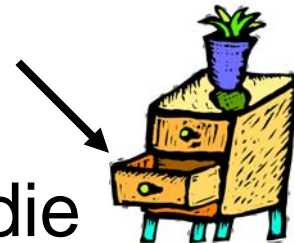

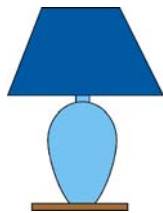
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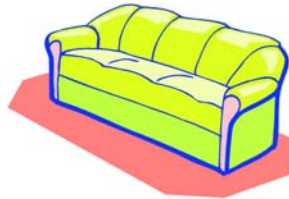
