

## CAMELS ALLITERATIONS

**Alliteration** is what happens when the words in a phrase or a sentence begin with the same letter and sound. Alliteration is used to make writing more interesting. It is also used to write tongue twisters.

Here is an example of an alliteration using the word **CAMELS** and its beginning **C** sound:

Camels could eat caramels constantly.

Camels carry colorful clothing.

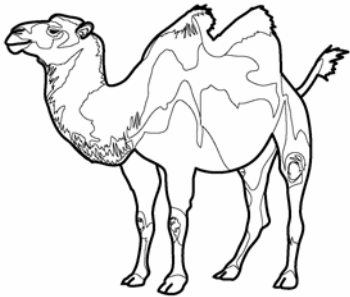


Many times the alliterations and tongue twisters are funny. Try your hand at writing alliteration. Use a dictionary to help you find words.

*The camel's breath smelled **like** rotten eggs.*

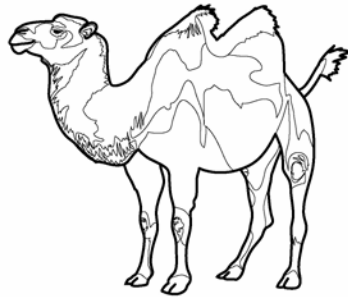
