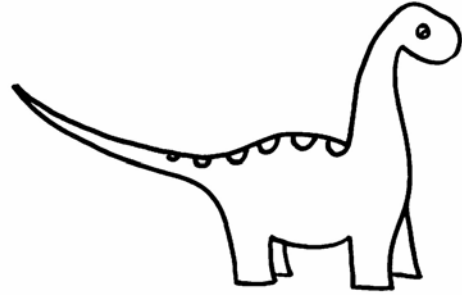


DINOSAUR ALLITERATIONS

Alliteration is what happens when the words in a phrase or a sentence begin with the same letter and sound. Alliteration is used to make writing more interesting, and also to write tongue twisters.

Here is an example of an alliteration using the word **DINOSAUR** and its beginning **D** sound:



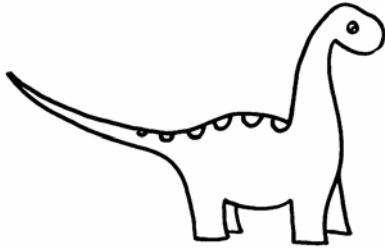
Dapper dinosaurs dance deightfully.
Do dinosaurs dream of dandelions?

Similes compare two things by using the words **like** or **as**. Think of things about dinosaurs. Write some similes about them.

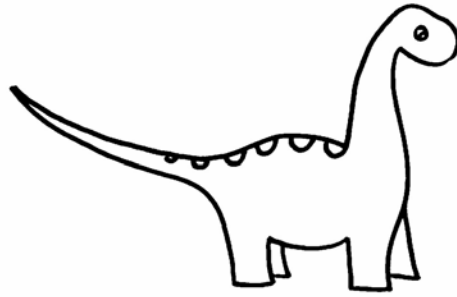
Here are two examples about dinosaurs:
