

DRAGON ALLITERATIONS

Alliteration is what happens when the words in a phrase or a sentence begin with the same letter and sound. Alliteration is used to make writing more interesting, and also to write tongue twisters.

Here is an example of an alliteration using the word **DRAGON** and its beginning **D** sound:



Dragons don't do dishes:
They dance and dream and dazzle.
