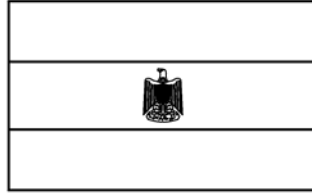


CAIRO



Cairo is the capital of Egypt and the largest city in Africa. It lies on the eastern bank of the Nile River. Its climate has hot dry days and cool nights. It has two basic seasons: eight months of summer and four months of winter. It only rains during the short winter season.

The vast majority of Cairo's population are Muslims. The rest are Egyptian Christians, called Copts. People in the oldest parts of the city live in slums. A number of Cairo's poorest inhabitants live in the district called the City of the Dead. The modern part of Cairo, including its elegant residential sectors, is in sharp contrast to the poor areas. The best known residential district is the Garden City.

Cairo is the cultural capital of the Middle East. Its architecture is rich and represents old Egyptian, Roman, and Arabic styles. The town features about six hundred Islamic monuments, including mosques, palaces, and tombs. As a center of higher education, it attracts students from many Arab countries. There is also an American University in Cairo. In the district Khan Khalil, numerous bazaars sell gold, copper, textiles, spices and leather goods.
